- 1. The meeting began with the pledge to the flag.

- b. The display background has not been ordered yet. Letty made the motion to buy a new historian's chair not to cost over \$200. Sandy seconded. Letty will find chair.
- c. 59 attended the French Louie & his Biographer. Some were disappointed it wasn't more about French Louie. 12 people did the historical walk and enjoyed it. 53 people attended the native American program and found it very interesting. Peggy suggested that next year we serve food. Barbara thought a program of Indians of this area would be of interest. 20 people enjoyed the tour of the Piseco Museum, Tannery and the Julia Preston Historical sign. While looking at the sign, her grand daughter came along and told some stories.

## NEW BUSINESS:
